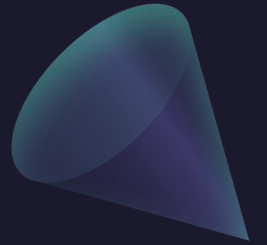
Thinking vs Mindset

- Objective is to keep the game in play



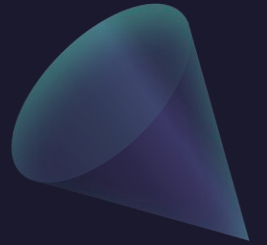
Field Training
